POP TAB COLLECTION

The "Pop Tab Program" is one of the on-going fund-raising programs that help support the Ronald McDonald house mission of being a "home-away-from-home" for the families of children receiving medical treatment in area medical facilities. Families are referred to the Ronald McDonald house by hospital social workers. The cost per day is minimal, and waived if the family is unable to pay. The average length of stay for the families is 9 days. The income received from recycling the pop tabs supports the cost of operating the Ronald McDonald House. It takes approximately 12 pounds of pop tabs to cover a family's \$5 room fee for a one-night stay.



POP TABs can be found on soda cans, soup cans, canned vegetables, etc. Look around your field offices for the "red roofed" and/or "blue roofed" Ronald McDonald Collection Houses. They can also be delivered or mailed to the Ronald McDonald House, 383 South Batavia Street, Orange, CA. For more information refer to www.rmhc.org.

BEING CAREFUL WITH E-MAIL ETIQUETTE

1- MAINTAIN grammar and spelling standards

You would never send a letter with misspelled words, incomplete sentences, wrong punctuation, grammatical errors, no greeting and no closing. Your e-mail should get the same attention. Remember to complete the subject heading.

2- DO NOT COMMUNICATE sensitive information

People tend to hide behind an e-mail because it feels safer than talking. If you need to deliver a sensitive message, call the person or set up a meeting vs. writing an e-mail.

3- IF YOU ARE ANGRY, do not send an e-mail

E-mails last forever and your emotions won't. Remember that people tend to "forward" e-mails they receive and about 30 percent of companies regularly monitor their employees' e-mail.

4- MAINTAIN discretion

Never put anything in e-mail that you would not want to see on the company's bulletin board. Don't send anything that could be viewed as sexist, sexual, racist, disparaging or proprietary.

5- DO NOT SEND jokes or chain letters

Unless a colleague or friend has given you permission to pass along a joke, don't.
