
Teamsters Local 63 hall. The community was out enjoying the day, there was food, games, vendors, and fun for everyone. Excellent job everyone involved in this event!

The resource fair, organized by the State Council on Developmental Disabilities and the Teamsters National Black Caucus, was geared to provide resources to aging adults and people with disabilities. The event provided individuals and families with resources to obtain job skills and independence, establish financial stability, and improve quality of life.

CWC provided Juan Pollo of Bloomington meals for all attending vendors and brought the fun with punch balloons, bubbles, and accessible games like Inflatable Bowling, Carrot Toss, and Limbo for participants.
